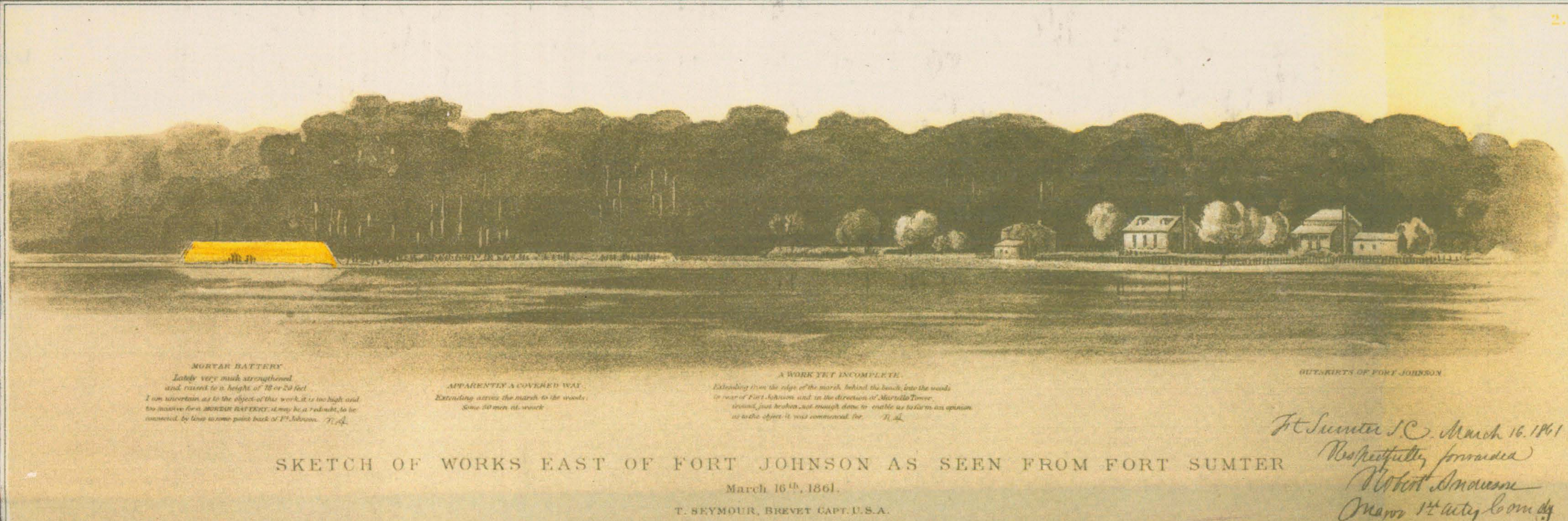


1. WORK, commenced recently probably to fire upon the main channel seaward.  
 2. ENCAMPMENT. One or more guns look upon the channel toward Ft. Moultrie. A mortar battery on the right near No. 3.  
 No. 1, 2 and 3 are connected.  
 3. BATTERY OF 3 HEAVY GUNS. Embasures very large. Line of fire makes an angle of 45° with the gorge of Ft. Sumter.  
 4. From this point the STAR OF THE WEST was fired upon. Battery covered by mud hill.  
 5. APPARENTLY A BATTERY behind this hill.  
 6. WORK, recently commenced. A battery of some 30 guns. Encampment.  
 7. WORK, recently finished. Apparently a Mortar Battery.  
 8. MORRIS ISLAND HEADQUARTERS.  
 9. IRON-CLAD BATTERY. Three heavy guns probably columbiads. Line of fire makes an angle of 20° with gorge of Fort Sumter.  
 10. BATTERY, not quite complete.  
 11. MORRIS POINT LANDING.

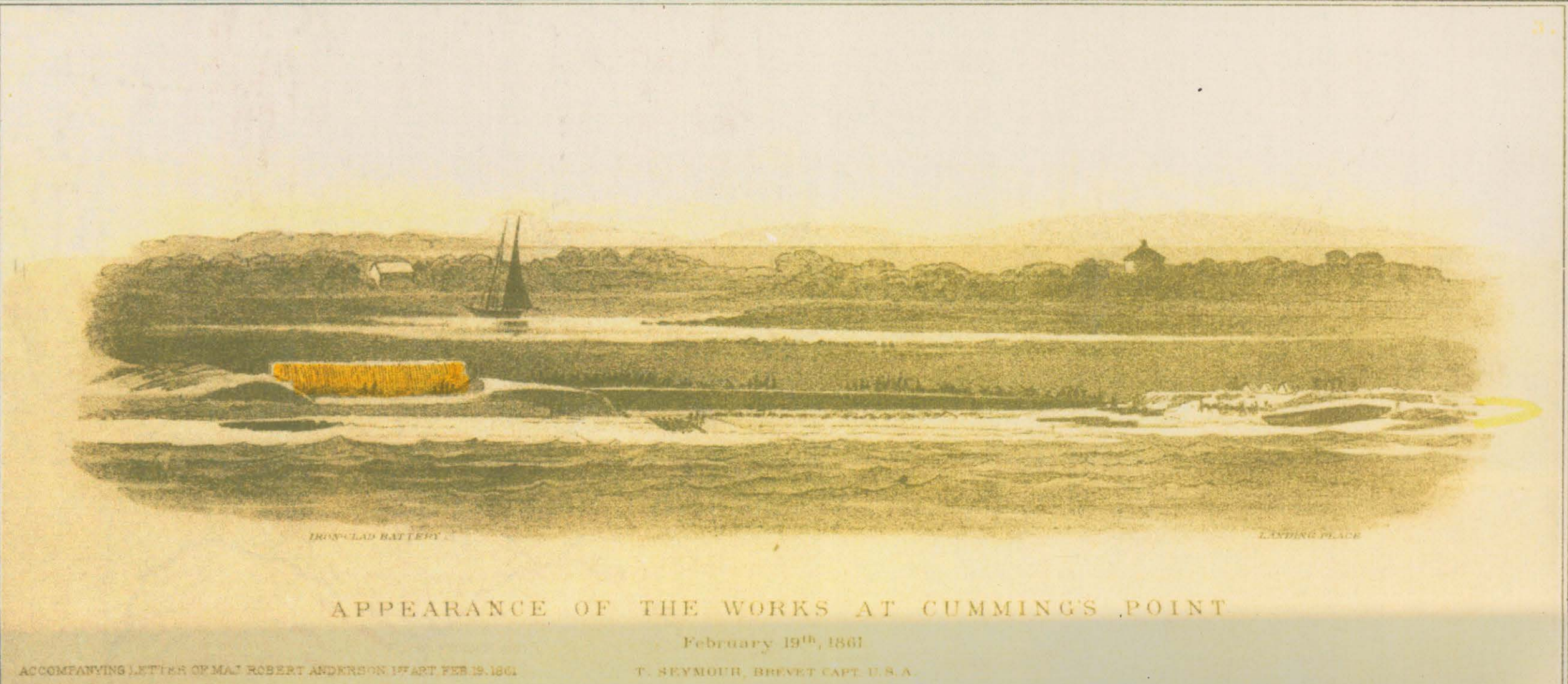

MORTAR BATTERY. Looks very much strengthened and raised to a height of 20 or 25 feet. I am uncertain as to the object of this work. It is too high and too massive for a MORTAR BATTERY. It may be a redoubt, to be connected by lines to some point back of Ft. Johnson. T.S.  
 APPARENTLY A COVERED WAY. Extending across the marsh to the woods. Some 50 men at work.  
 A WORK YET INCOMPLETE. Extending from the edge of the marsh, behind the beach, into the woods in rear of Fort Johnson and in the direction of Morrisville Tower. Ground just broken, not enough done to enable us to form an opinion as to the object. It was commenced the 7<sup>th</sup>. T.S.
